# **Town Administrator:**

In addition to the regular business of the Town including the bi-weekly review of Accounts Payable, the past week began with the Annual Town Meeting which was attended by 916 voters and concluded with my attendance at a meeting of NHMA. Between those 2 events I responded to a 91-A request, conferred with counsel regarding a conveyance of property in 1958 and started discussions with Health Insurance providers to review rates considering the projected HealthTrust increases.

#### **Assessor:**

The Assessing office processed abatements, exemptions, and credit applications, reviewed and applied Boundary line adjustments and subdivisions. In the coming weeks, those taxpayers with outstanding permits or those with work that was unfinished as of 4/1/23 should expect a visit from Rick Earls from Cross Country Appraisal. License Plate # CCAG 4 in the next month.

# **Finance:**

Last week in Finance, accounts payables were processed by Carol; I created bank deposits for the treasurer; calculated retro pay owed to employees as a result of the passing of the warrant article for a 3% COLA; prepared new PAF forms for signature for the new pay rates; distributed the new PAF forms to the departments for the employee signatures; attended the monthly department head meeting and took notes; created and entered miscellaneous general journal entries; reconciled bank statements for February; answered citizen's questions; processed a new application for town assistance and created and mailed out necessary verification forms; miscellaneous file maintenance and upkeep.

#### **Building Inspector:**

The Building Department performed 5 inspections and attended three meetings. We finished up a few projects for the Town Administrator, one of these being the restructuring of the fee schedule. This coming week we will be reaching out to the residents to touch base on older projects. We took a ride over to the Police Station to help out with some minor repairs of the building. The truck had new rear brakes installed due to leaking cylinders and a new headlight bulb. Congratulations to Harding Metals on the new maintenance building!
