Town Administrator:

In addition to reviewing and approving the bi-weekly AP and general administrative duties, I prepared for and attended the first meeting of the Hazard Mitigation Plan Update. The update occurs every 5 years and is a HSEM/FEMA requirement for the Town to be eligible for State & Federal grant funding. Research was conducted on a number of questions forwarded by the Board meeting of 03/26.

Finance:

Last week in Finance, I processed accounts payable; prepared bank deposits for the treasurer; attended a meeting for the Hazard Mitigation plan update; created and entered miscellaneous journal entries; worked with an ongoing welfare case; and prepared reimbursement requests for the Treasurer for expenses in the first quarter from special revenue funds.

Building Inspector:

The Building department had 10 inspections last week with two of these being finals. We also attended two meetings. We have completed the entire list of open permits. We started with 364 in January and ended with 181 open ongoing. Adding the 50 recent projects in the mix there is 231 open projects as of Today. As April 15th approaches, we would like to remind everyone to get their seasonal camping permits. These permits make the town aware of the temporary occupancies and can help to locate in case of emergencies.

Recreation:

Northwood Parks and Recreation department had a fantastic weekend celebrating Easter on Friday night. We had over 30 adults attend our Second Annual Ault Easter Egg Hunt. They had a great time, and a lot of laughs. Saturday morning was our Annual Kids Easter Egg Hunt with over 250 excited little ones with their Easter baskets, searching for 4000 eggs filled with toys and candy, both were fantastic events despite the strong winds but as we live in New England, you never know what you're gonna get. Mark the first day of registration for summer swim lessons at Lantern Light Camp. This is our first collaboration with the camp and hopefully is successful as of this writing registration is going strong, so I'm sure it'll be filled in the next few days. Registration for Spring Soccer is coming to an end, and we have 150 soccer players already registered. These are children from preschool to eighth grade. It's still time to get your tickets for the food truck festival. This is Northwood Rec departments largest fundraising event with over 1000 expected to attend.
